a) Parish Council Bank Account.

To agree to open an additional Parish Council Bank Account.

Banking Arrangements

The council's funds are held across two Co-operative Bank accounts:

• Community Direct Plus Account: £79,000.

• 14-Day Account: £41,000.

Key Concerns:

• Members have identified that holding significant reserves in one institution is not best practice, as it poses potential risks to financial security.

Proposed Action:

- Open a new account with another provider to diversify holdings and reduce risk.
- Recommended providers include:
 - 1. Unity Trust Bank: Offers a 24-month fixed-term, no-access account with a competitive interest rate of 4.25% (as of 9 December 2024).
 - 2. Other options include Nationwide, Cambridge, and Hampshire Trust Bank.
 - 3. Transfer £50,000 into the new account to maximise annual return and protect PC finances.

Members discussed and agreed to the banking recommendations to open a new bank account with Unity Trust Bank, this was proposed by Cllr Shelley, seconded by Cllr Wise and agreed by all present.

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

(2) On its north side from the permit parking bays opposite number 7 Sandy Mount for a distance of 50 metres in a south easterly direction. WARE STREET – DYL - On both sides from a point 15 metres northwest of its junction with Hockers Lane for a distance of 35 metres in a south easterly direction. A full statement of the Council's reasons for making the proposed Order, a plan indicating the location and the effect and a copy of any other Orders which will be amended by the proposed Order may be examined at Kent Highways & Transportation, Kent County Council, Kroner House, Eurogate Business Park, Ashford, TN24 8XU by appointment booked through tro@kent.gov.uk or viewed online from 7 February 2025 at www.kent.gov.uk/highwaysconsultations

It was reported that the fencing between Crismill Lane and the high-speed rail line was damaged near the footpath.

<u>Signage on the A20</u> - It was noted that old signage from previous road closures remained on-site along the A20, despite the closures having ended. The Clerk was asked to report this to Kent County Council to arrange for their removal.

Cllr Stark reported that there had been incidents of motorbikes speeding along the A20 late at night.

Members discussed the poor condition of the grass verges outside the Woodland Trust and the benefits of extending the wooden posts to prevent parking in this area. It was agreed that the Clerk would liaise with KCC Officer Greg Nichols to determine whether this could be included in the Parish Council's Highways Improvement Plan.
